Hi,

I asked a question at the webinar last night, about the proposed removal of the roundabouts but the answer given was rather vague and , in my opinion, didn't answer the question . I would like to know what benefits there will be to local people and long-distance travellers that will justify the disruption, expense and effect on the climate of the emissions from construction (including the use of a lot of concrete which is extremely environmentally unfriendly) .I was told that it will make the road 'more robust' and 'resilient'. Please could you explain exactly what this means and how exactly this will benefit people who live in Llanfairfechan and the users of the A55 and how these benefits would outweigh such a major investment in terms of time, money, environmental impact , disruption and alteration to our village.

I understand that the production of the concrete alone would be the equivalent of flying a full Jumbo Jet continuously for 9 years. In the light of the Welsh Government's Future Generations Act 2015 how is this development going to provide a better environment for future generations. The construction of the A55 has facilitated a massive increase in vehicle use in North Wales. How will this development benefit the communities of Penmaenmawr and Llanfairfechan in the future? Please can you be specific about the long term goals of the removal of these roundabouts.
